



The provider roles described below do not see patients outside of an inpatient hospital setting. If you have questions, please contact your primary care physician. If you do not have a primary care physician, please call (800) 737-7900 or (859) 301-DOCS (3627).

- **Hospitalist:** Physicians whose focus is the medical care of hospitalized patients.
- Laborist: Physicians whose focus is the management of hospital care for pregnant women in labor.
- Pathologist: Laboratory-based physicians who examine tissues, check the accuracy of lab tests, interpret the results and serve as a consultant to other physicians.
- Palliative Care: Physicians whose focus is on hospitalized patients' physical pain and symptoms while also addressing their emotional/spiritual needs to provide comfort during a serious illness.
- Geriatrics: Providers whose focus is to prevent and treat diseases or disabilities of elderly patients, commonly in nursing homes.
- History & Physical: Hospital-based physicians who perform a history & physical prior to a surgical procedure.
- House Physician: Physicians who supplement the care of hospitalized patients when the primary physician is not immediately available.
- PRN Physician: Physicians who see patients on an "as needed" basis. For example, a physician who provides vacation coverage or medical leave coverage for another physician.
